

# Floors & Walls Care

*Designed to be lived in, cared for with intention.*



**Floors and walls** define the look and feel of your home and are exposed to daily wear. With the right care, suitable products and simple habits, their appearance and durability can be preserved for years to come.





# Porcelain & Ceramic Tiles

Sweep or vacuum regularly to remove dust and grit that can cause surface wear.

Mop using warm water and a pH-neutral cleaner to maintain the finish without leaving residue.

## Recommended:

- White King Tile & Floor Cleaner (or equivalent tile-safe cleaner)
- Sabco Floor Cleaner (pH-neutral or equivalent)
- Microfibre mop and cloths

Avoid abrasive pads, acidic cleaners and bleach-heavy products, as these may dull tile surfaces and damage grout over time.









# Timber Floors

Sweep or vacuum frequently using a soft brush attachment to prevent scratches.

Clean with a lightly damp (not wet) mop using a timber-specific cleaner designed to protect the finish.

## Recommended:

- Bona Timber Floor Cleaner (or equivalent timber-safe cleaner)
- Osmo Wash and Care (or equivalent)
- Microfibre mop

Avoid excess water, steam mops and harsh detergents, as moisture can cause swelling, warping and long-term damage to timber surfaces.









# Laminate Floors

Vacuum or sweep regularly to remove dirt and debris. Clean with a lightly damp mop and a laminate-safe cleaner, ensuring no water is left sitting on the surface.

## Recommended:

- Bona Laminate Floor Cleaner (or equivalent laminate-safe cleaner)
- Microfibre mop with minimal moisture

Avoid steam mops, soaking the floor or using abrasive cleaners, as moisture may penetrate joints and cause swelling or damage.









# Vinyl Floors

Sweep or vacuum frequently to prevent grit buildup. Mop using warm water and a vinyl-safe, pH-neutral cleaner to maintain flexibility and finish.

## Recommended:

- Bona Vinyl Floor Cleaner (or equivalent vinyl-safe cleaner)
- Mild pH-neutral detergent diluted in warm water
- Microfibre mop

Avoid solvent-based cleaners, abrasive pads and excessive water, as these may damage the surface layer or affect long-term performance.









# Walls & Painted Surfaces

Dust walls regularly using a soft cloth or duster.  
Spot clean marks gently using a damp cloth and a mild, pH-neutral detergent, testing first in an inconspicuous area.

## Recommended:

- Warm water with mild pH-neutral dishwashing liquid
- Microfibre cloths or soft sponges

Avoid abrasive cleaners or aggressive scrubbing, as this may damage painted finishes or alter surface sheen.





# Everyday Care Tips



Place mats at entry points to  
reduce dirt and moisture



Use felt pads under furniture  
to prevent scratching



Clean spills immediately  
to avoid staining



Avoid dragging heavy  
furniture across floors



Use rugs or runners in high-  
traffic areas
